The references chosen should provide explicit details that highlight the applicant's commitment to academics, participation in extracurricular activities, and recognition of any awards or honors they have received. In addition, chosen references should emphasize the applicant's unique strengths and qualities that make them a strong candidate. This could include the applicants' creativity, intellectual curiosity, adversity, resilience, and determination. Each application must include:

- One letter of reference from a current teacher
- One letter of reference from **any teacher at your high school**
